## 2011 Wyoming Legislature Final Report

Below is a bill by bill report on action during the General Session of the 61<sup>st</sup> Wyoming State Legislature. In **bold** is: Bill number (HB=House Bill, HR=House Resolution, SF=Senate File, SR=Senate Resolution), catch title of bill, sponsor, status (D=died, H or S EA[enrolled act number], or S for signed by the Governor for Resolutions), if signed the chapter number, and on the next line y for watch, opp for opposed, mon for monitor, and supp for support. A brief synopsis of the bill follows. After the bill summaries, there is a summary of upcoming interim topics believed to be of interest. After the written report is a spreadsheet of all bill introduced during this general session. Please don't hesitate to contact me with any questions you might have regarding the report. There are a few enrolled acts upon which the Governor has not yet acted; we will inform you of these actions, and some clarification we are seeking on a couple of bills. **HB0011**      **Wyoming Food Freedom Act.**      **Agriculture**      **D**  
y              opp

This is similar to bills introduced in previous sessions by Rep. Wallis, where food safety inspections would be eliminated for many home-based operations. We continue to oppose this measure as it would expose many other producers to unwarranted public relations problems. Billed died in the house agriculture committee 4-5. Also see HB0226 and HB0228.

**HB0012**      **Irrigation districts-change of place of use.**      **Agriculture**      **D**  
y              mon

Brought at the request of the Goshen Irrigation District, it would have allowed an irrigation district to change place of use within the district, due to non-use by district members (think about district lands now developed, but still paying assessments). The bill was opposed by the State Engineer, who pointed out that no provision was made to accommodate upstream and downstream users, whose appropriation might be affected. Also would have been difficult to implement in districts with more than one appropriation date. State Engineer's Office discussed this issue after the bill died at a SEO hearing. This will topic will likely be discussed during interim.

**HB0015**      **Weed and pest control.**      **Agriculture**      **HEA 016 ch037 7/1/2011**  
y              mon

This committee bill was brought to interim late in the last meeting of Joint Agriculture last October, where substantial changes were made to what was initially proposed by Weed & Pest Council. The bill as signed updates language and definitions to conform with other statutes, clarifies enforcement procedures, creates the means to make an 'Emergency Declaration', sets minimum bond for District treasurers at \$50,000, specifically allows Districts to buy and sell real property and equipment, specifies that cost sharing for chemicals, application, and any other IPM practice for control of designated or declared noxious weeds and pests is allowed, and places three criteria on Districts during administrative procedures for enforcing the act. W&P Council listen to WABA concerns, districts will meet with private applicators/dealers that work in same counties.

**HB0022**      **Phased in fuel tax increase.**      **Transportation**      **D**  
y              mon

This committee bill would have increased road tax on gasoline, diesel by \$0.03/gallon on July 1, 2011, July 1, 2012, and by \$0.04 on July 1, 2013, supported by trucking association. Failed Committee of the Whole in the house.

**HB0030**      **Execution of judgment liens.**      **Gingery**      **HEA 006 ch016 7/1/2011**  
y              mon

Clarifies that certified appraiser can do appraisal for judgment lien sales, rather than three disinterested parties, sale must still be at 2/3 or more of appraised value.

**HB0033**      **Exceeding speed limit while passing.**      **Mcomie**      **D**  
y              supp

Bill would have allowed a driver to exceed speed limit by ten miles per hour, when passing on a two-lane road, on roads with speed limit 55 mph or higher. Passed house, died in senate transportation.

<b>HB0043</b>	<b>Workers' compensation appeals.</b> y mon	<b>Zwonitz,Dn</b>	<b>D</b>			
	Would have mandated review of district court judgments on workers' compensation appeals by state supreme court; died 2-7 in house judiciary committee.					
<b>HB0045</b>	<b>Agricultural property taxation.</b> Y mon	<b>Gingery</b>	<b>D</b>			
	An effort to place dude ranches and outfitter's grazing operations in agricultural property tax class, failed 1-7 in house revenue committee.					
<b>HB0055</b>	<b>Executive orders.</b> y supp	<b>Wallis</b>	<b>D</b>			
	Due to the executive order of Gov. Freudenthal regarding core sage grouse habitat, bill was brought to place sideboards on executive orders, providing review by portion of legislature, and allowed such acts to be covered by provisions of the Wyoming Regulatory Takings Act. Also provided for maximum four year sunset on any such order, although Governor could renew such orders. Failed to pass house judiciary committee by an unrecorded vote.					
<b>HB0059</b>	<b>Renewable resources electricity-tax exemption.</b> y mon		<b>Revenue D</b>			
	Would have extended sales and use tax exemption on renewable energy generation systems under 25 kilowatts, and systems completely off-grid, from June 30, 2012 to June 30, 2022. Died in house revenue committee 2-6-1.					
<b>HB0061</b>	<b>Omnibus water bill-planning.</b> y supp	<b>Water</b>		<b>HEA005 ch001</b>	<b>2/15/2011</b>	
	Traditional select water/agriculture committee bill for water project planning.					
<b>HB0066</b>	<b>Water development projects-funding.</b> y supp	<b>Water</b>		<b>HEA 018 ch035</b>	<b>2/18/2011</b>	
	One of the traditional companion bills to HB0061, provides cost share/loans for projects already studied. Only exception are extremely large projects, such as the Gillette Madison project.					
<b>HB0082</b>	<b>Unfair employment practices.</b> y mon	<b>Byrd</b>	<b>D</b>			
	Representative Byrd brought this bill to extend the protections of the unfair employment practices act to retaliation for acts made illegal under the act, or making a charge, testifying, assisting or participating in any manner in any legal action under the act. Bill was defeated in the house 30-30 on committee of the whole.					
<b>HB0089</b>	<b>Safe transportation of Wyoming workers act.</b> y mon	<b>Esquibel,K</b>	<b>D</b>			
	Representative Esquibel's bill would have extended all FMCSA requirements for vehicles transporting 16 or more people, to any contract carrier of employees. Intended to target Union Pacific, and Burlington Northern Santa Fe contract employee carriers, but would have extended to almost any hired vehicle carrying a worker for any company. Bill died in house transportation committee, with no publicly recorded vote.					
<b>HB0120</b>	<b>Public meetings.</b> y mon	<b>Edmonds</b>	<b>D</b>			
	This bill, primarily supported by the Wyoming Press Association, would have required twelve hours of notice before any emergency public meeting, and would have required audio recordings of all executive sessions, regardless of the size of the special district, or state political entity, excepting the legislature. The audio recording could be accessed via court order, after an 'in camera' review by the judge. We primarily had an issue with how to secure such recordings, and who would need to maintain the recording, and for what length of time. This bill died on 3 <sup>rd</sup> Reading, in the senate. Look for this topic to be taken up during interim.					
<b>HB0121</b>	<b>Public records.</b> y mon	<b>Edmonds</b>	<b>D</b>			
	Representative Edmonds' second public access bill would have generally allowed three business days for any public entity to produce a requested record. The entity would only be allowed to charge for actual cost of duplication, regardless of the amount of work required to collect the materials requested. Costs for labor could only be charged when data must be compiled, extracted, or redacted to comply with the request. This bill died in Committee of the Whole in the senate, it will also be considered during the interim, along with HB0120.					
<b>HB0124</b>	<b>Nat'l guard-emer deploy prof licensing.</b> y supp	<b>Transportation</b>		<b>HEA 042 ch094</b>	<b>3/2/2011</b>	
	While serving in state active service, members of Wyoming National Guard are exempt from any state licensing requirement. Note that this is only while acting for the Guard, during active service. It does not exempt a Guard member from license requirements when acting for any other employer within Wyoming.					
<b>HB0128</b>	<b>Ethanol tax credit.</b> y opp	<b>Zwonitz,Dv</b>	<b>D</b>			
	Representative Dave Zwontizer's bill would have decreased the ethanol tax credit from \$0.40 per gallon, to \$0.10 per gallon, with all other conditions remaining in place, such as credit expiring 15 years after a facilities latest expansion. This bill died in house revenue 3-5-1, but a bill cancelling the credit for any future ethanol plants, or expansion of existing plants passed and was signed into law (HB0259).

<b>HB0143</b>	<b>Manufacturing tax exemption.</b> y mon	<b>Miller</b>	<b>HEA 043 ch083</b>	<b>7/1/2011</b>
Representative Miller's bill extended the manufacturing equipment sales and use tax exemption until June 30, 2017. The primary motivation was the wind energy manufacturing facility that was looking at a location near Cheyenne.				
<b>HB0145</b>	<b>Vehicle registration-timing.</b> y mon	<b>Esquibel,K</b>	<b>D</b>	
This bill would have extended the time to register a new vehicle, from 45 days to 65 days. The bill passed the house, but died in senate revenue committee.				
<b>HB0146</b>	<b>Vehicle sales and use tax.</b> y mon	<b>Esquibel,K</b>	<b>D</b>	
Representative Ken Esquibel's companion bill to HB0145 would have extended the time to pay sales or use tax on vehicles brought into Wyoming from 50 days to 65 days. This bill also passed the house and died in the senate revenue committee.				
<b>HB0147</b>	<b>Excise tax-vendor compensation.</b> y mon	<b>Zwonitz,Dv</b>	<b>HEA 096</b>	
If a vendor is required to submit sales tax, and does so by the 15 <sup>th</sup> day of the month due, the vendor is allowed to retain 1.95% of the first \$6,250 due, and 1.00% of the amount above \$6,250, up to a total credit of \$500 per month. This will be taken from the state's share of the sales tax, thus local sales tax receipts are not affected. The Governor has not yet acted on this bill; we will issue a report on this bill once the Governor acts, or the bill becomes law.				
<b>HB0152</b>	<b>Very rare or uncommon area designations.</b> y supp	<b>Semlek</b>	<b>HEA 069 ch140</b>	<b>7/1/2011</b>
This bill removes the authority of the Environmental Quality Council to designate any real property within the state as 'Very Rare or Uncommon'. Strictly speaking, this designation only prohibits surface non-coal mining, but in practice BLM has used this as a cultural value, and used the designation to declare an area a 'Wilderness Study Area'. It was generally felt that federal acts after this law was enacted have adequately protected such areas. There was also concern that these designations were a 'Regulatory Taking', especially as it was used in the Adobe Town VR or U Designation, where 10,000 acres of private land including mineral rights, was designated. The bill did not revoke any existing designations, but allows the EQC to remove such designations.				
<b>HB0153</b>	<b>Agricultural gas tax refund program.</b> y supp	<b>Semlek</b>	<b>HEA 044 ch099</b>	<b>7/1/2011</b>
This bill eliminates the gasoline agricultural tax exemption, which allowed a qualified agricultural producer to <u>not</u> pay 70% of the road tax due on gasoline, via bulk sales of greater than 100 gallons, for agricultural use, at the time of purchase. Agricultural users can now request a refund of such tax paid, in accordance with their use of gasoline from bulk sales (any amount over 35 gallons in one sale, not dispensed into the tank of a registered highway vehicle). The law takes effect on July 1, 2011, but we have written the Department of Transportation, requesting clarification of how existing exemptions will be handled, i.e. if an exemption expires before July 1, 2011, must the producer renew the exemption, or can they take the new refund on any amount purchased prior to July 1, 2011 (but less than one year prior). The total amount claimed for refund cannot exceed what the producer reports for credit to the Internal Revenue Service. We will inform you as WYDOT responds to our concerns. Petroleum retailers were concerned with 'financing' the tax that producers did not have to pay under an exemption, until WYDOT issued them a refund. Retailers were also concerned with keeping track of valid exemption certificates. We will be involved as WYDOT develops the new form by rule; we understand that producers will be able to use one form to request both gasoline and clear diesel refunds.				
<b>HB0162</b>	<b>OSHA rule review.</b> y mon	<b>Burkhart</b>	<b>D</b>	
Representative Burkhart's bill would have required a review of OSHA rules every five years, to see if they were adequate to protect workers. It only applied to workers in the oil and gas industry, but we watched to see if coverage was extended to other industries. The bill died on 3 <sup>rd</sup> reading in the house.				
<b>HB0179</b>	<b>Energy improvement program.</b> y mon	<b>Petroff</b>	<b>HEA 071 ch152</b>	<b>7/1/2011</b>
Allows municipalities and counties to make loans available to improve energy efficiency improvements to real property. Mandates that local utilities be notified 30 days before such programs takeeffect.				
<b>HB0185</b>	<b>Fuel tax-LUST funding.</b> y opp	<b>Zwonitz,Dv</b>	<b>D</b>	
This bill would have increased the Leaking Underground Storage Tank tax from \$0.01 per gallon of diesel or gasoline, to \$0.02 per gallon. Bill was rejected in house revenue committee; proponents were not willing to testify that this would speed up mitigation of unclaimed underground storage tanks. I testified against; this tax is not refundable to agricultural producers.

<b>HB0195</b>	<b>Motor vehicle registration fees. Vranish</b>	<b>D</b>
	<b>y        supp</b>	
	Representative Vranish's bill would have continued to decrease county vehicle registration fees in the seventh through tenth years of a vehicle's service. Currently, the registration fee in the sixth year of service remains the continuing rate for the life of the vehicle. The bill died in house revenue committee 2-7.	
<b>HB0207</b>	<b>Protection of activities in private vehicles. Krone</b>	<b>D</b>
	<b>y        opp</b>	
	Representative Krone's bill would have allowed person's to carry a firearm in their private vehicles (subject to locking vehicle and keeping firearm out of sight), even on their employer's private property parking lot. Our primary motive in modifying the bill was that landowner surface use agreements could continue to have the conditions of no firearms brought in by surface operations, but the employer would have no way to enforce these surface use provisions. There was also concern that this statute would violate OSHA safe workplace rules. The bill was nearly unanimously opposed by business community.	
<b>HB0208</b>	<b>Off-road vehicle registration-exemption. Shepperson</b>	<b>HEA 084   ch158   3/3/2011</b>
	<b>y        supp</b>	
	HB0208 makes clear that ORV's that are used solely in agricultural operations are exempt from registration requirements. Several county clerks had been charging registration fees, even if the owner stated that the ORV would be operated solely within boundaries of a private agricultural operation.	
<b>HB0217</b>	<b>Production states agreement. Lubnau</b>	<b>HEA 058   ch092   3/2/2011</b>
	<b>y        supp</b>	
	Representative Lubnau's bill creates a mechanism for western state's legislatures to interact, and respond jointly to federal actions that impact energy production in the west.	
<b>HB0222</b>	<b>Recreational considerations, public land exchanges. Harshman</b>	<b>D</b>
	<b>y        opp</b>	
	Representative Harshman felt that recreation amenities in a particular appraisal of state land was not given due weight. The bill would have required any appraisal of state lands to weight recreation values above recreation amenities contained within the phrase 'Highest and Best Use'. We opposed the bill on behalf of the American Society of Farm Managers and Rural Appraisers. The bill died 3-6 in the house agriculture committee.	
<b>HB0228</b>	<b>Food freedom act-2. Eklund</b>	<b>D</b>
	<b>y        opp</b>	
	Essentially a carbon-copy of HB0011, this bill also died in committee.	
<b>HB0240</b>	<b>Workplace safety. Blake</b>	<b>D</b>
	<b>y        opp</b>	
	Representative Blake's bill would have increase OSHA violation fines from \$5,000-\$70,000, to \$8,000-\$120,000 for each violation, with additional increase fines for violations resulting in a death, and also for 'serious' violations. It would have also increase the fine for posting violations from \$7,000 to \$12,000. The final provision would have required the commission to adjust all fines in the statute by the urban consumer price index at least every four years. The bill was not reported out of house minerals committee prior to the Committee of the Whole cutoff.	
<b>HB0244</b>	<b>Unemployment insurance amendments. Connolly</b>	<b>D</b>
	<b>y        opp</b>	
	Representative Connolly's bill would have extended unemployment insurance coverage, as well as adding several additional reasons why initial coverage would be offered. While bill passed house minerals 5-3-1, the measure was defeated in house Committee of the Whole by a vote of 25-34-1.	
<b>HJ0003</b>	<b>Resol to Congress &amp; the U S Supreme Court. Childers</b>	<b>D</b>
	<b>y        supp</b>	
	While we supported the subject of this bill, which asks Congress and the U.S. Supreme Court to stop passing bills, or rendering decisions that encroach on states' rights, there is always a question as to whether such resolutions accomplish anything. The resolution passed the house, and senate revenue committee, it was not heard in senate Committee of the Whole.	
<b>SF0001</b>	<b>General government appropriations -2    Appropriations</b>	<b>SEA 068   ch088   3/2/2011</b>
	<b>y        mon</b>	
	Governor Mead only used his line-item veto for two items; 1) the \$450, 000 appropriated toward a new governor's mansion, and; 2) language pertaining to judicial salaries, which 'preserves the separation of powers, "to the best of his ability.'" The department of agriculture has requested that the governor allow them to fill the deputy director position, but WDA had not received word as of March 4 regarding this request. We would note that this supplemental bill only authorizes the Governor to approve 7 additional positions throughout state government, prior to the end of this biennium. Other items in the supplemental budget of interest are: 1) \$250,000 for the Governor's office to study necessity of deep water ports to facilitate the export of Wyoming non-renewable resources in large volumes (read that as unit-trains of coal), and; 2)\$610,000 for WYDOT to study transportation impacts of mineral exploration in southeast Wyoming (Niobrara field), and; 3) \$1,000,000 to local fire districts, via the county commissioners regarding mineral exploration and production in southeast Wyoming, and;

4)\$3.95 million to WYDOT to continue existing commercial air service in Wyoming, through June 30, 2012, and; 5)\$811,000 to the Livestock Board for computerization, including G forms (commuter permits).

<b>SF0003</b>	<b>Campaign finance-organizations.</b> <b>y opp</b>	<b>Corporations</b>	<b>SEA 048 ch074</b>	<b>2/24/2011</b>
	We opposed this bill based on input received from the Northern Broadcast Network. The end bill does <u>not</u> required reporting of donors during the advertisement, as the original bill did, but does require reporting to the secretary of state from 1-2 weeks prior to the election in question, in a manner similar to candidates, political action committees, etc.			
<b>SF0009</b>	<b>Economic analysis.</b> <b>y supp</b>	<b>Agriculture</b>	<b>SEA 086 ch154</b>	<b>3/3/2011</b>
	This bill adds a position to the economic analysis division of the A&I department, to allow use of the REMI model on a county and regional basis, at the request of county commissioners. Such data can be used for commenting on federal regulatory actions. It will add consistency to county economic data presented to BLM, US Forest Service, and EPA among others. A similar bill was vetoed after last session by the previous Governor.			
<b>SF0010</b>	<b>Protection of livestock animals.</b> <b>y supp</b>	<b>Agriculture</b>	<b>SEA 054 ch100</b>	<b>7/1/2011</b>
	This bill clarifies the livestock cruelty provisions in state law, details practices that cannot be defined as cruel, increases penalties for cruelty. The bill also lists species covered by the act, and certain uses of animals being permitted, such as laboratory animals, and rodeos. This was the result of two years of interim work by the joint agriculture committee; a companion bill that places authority for cruelty to pets under the purview of county commissioners (SF0100) also passed.			
<b>SF0018</b>	<b>FMCSA Compliance.</b> <b>y supp</b>	<b>Transportation</b>	<b>SEA 018 ch031</b>	<b>7/1/2011</b>
	This committee bill updates Wyoming statutes to make the most recent changes in FMCSA valid in Wyoming. The provisions enacted are already known to commercial carriers.			
<b>SF0031</b>	<b>Off-road vehicle definition.</b> <b>n</b>	<b>Travel</b>	<b>SEA 005 ch009</b>	<b>7/1/2011</b>
	This bill increases the maximum weight of a vehicle to be classified as an off-road-vehicle to 1,100 pounds, from the current 900 pounds. All other provisions remain in place.			
<b>SF0039</b>	<b>Aquatic invasive species-reciprocity.</b> <b>y supp</b>	<b>Travel</b>	<b>SEA 042 ch073</b>	<b>7/1/2011</b>
	Allows the Game and Fish Commission to establish joint fees for aquatic species control with adjacent states, where the water body is in both states.			
<b>SF0044</b>	<b>Government competition.</b> <b>y supp</b>	<b>Case</b>	<b>D</b>	
	Provided a formal means to lodge a complaint when a private business believes that state or local government is competing with their private business within Wyoming. We supported the bill, which passed senate corporations committee 3-1-1, but the bill failed Committee of the Whole in the senate 14-16.			
<b>SF0061</b>	<b>Co-employee immunity.</b> <b>y supp</b>	<b>Bebout</b>	<b>D</b>	
	Would have 'fixed' loophole in Workmen's Compensation Act that allows injured workers to sue a co-employee for damages, due an accident compensated for by Workmen's Compensation. This has been an issue since a Wyoming Supreme Court decision in 1996. This time, this bill was reported out of committee, but died in Committee of the Whole in the senate, 13-17.			
<b>SF0065</b>	<b>Animal remedies.</b> <b>y supp</b>	<b>Agriculture</b>	<b>SEA 052 ch098</b>	<b>7/1/2011</b>
	This bill update the antiquated Animal Remedies Act, enacted in 1929. Since then, FDA has begun regulating medicated feeds, and considerable federal regulation has occurred. This was a major rewrite, and brings this statute into conformity with current practice regarding registration of animal remedies.			
<b>SF0072</b>	<b>Fair practices of equipment act amendment.</b> <b>y supp</b>	<b>Christensen</b>	<b>SEA 064 ch133</b>	<b>7/1/2011</b>
	This bill brings dealers of multipurpose vehicles, snowmobiles, and off-road recreation vehicles into the fair practices of equipment dealers act, which sets out the conditions of manufacturers terminating agreements with Wyoming dealers.			
<b>SF0078</b>	<b>Temporary instream flows.</b> <b>y opp</b>	<b>Case</b>	<b>D</b>	
	This bill, a perennial favorite of Senator Case, was defeated 0-5 in senate agriculture committee.			
<b>SF0086</b>	<b>Agricultural fuel tax exemption .Meier</b> <b>y supp</b>		<b>D</b>

Senator Meier's bill would have made a single application for agricultural fuel tax exemption good for a period of four years. While the bill passed out of senate revenue committee, it failed both 3<sup>rd</sup> reading, and reconsideration, in part due to realization that the issue being addressed was also addressed by HB0153. See the discussion on HB0153 for gasoline tax refund procedures.

**SF0113**      **Surveyors and engineers practice act-revisions.**      **Johnson**      **D**  
**y**      **opp**

Senator Johnson's bill was a complete rewrite of the surveyors and engineers practice act. Conferred with counterparts in construction, surveying, design and other fields, who felt matter had not been vetted before concerned professions. Passed senate 28-2, but died in house minerals committee on a do not pass motion (assumed, because vote was recorded as 9-0).

**SF0117**      **Wyoming reclamation and restoration center.**      **Bebout**      **SEA 031**      **ch053**      **2/18/2011**  
**y**      **supp**

Senator Bebout's bill creates a challenge account for the University of Wyoming Reclamation and Restoration Center, and appropriates \$1.5 million from the abandon mine lands fund to be matched by donations to the fund. Matching will occur once the university receives at least \$100,000 in donations toward the fund. The bill also creates oversight for the center by an ad hoc committee appointed by the dean of the college of agriculture.

**SF0122**      **Water rights-federal lands.**      **Hicks**      **D**  
**y**      **opp**

This bill was very similar to SF0046, stock water permits, except for additional proposals as to water appropriations based on prohibiting beneficial use of water by wildlife. The bill died in senate agriculture committee 2-3.

**SF0124**      **Overweight and oversize vehicle penalties.** **Esquibel,F**      **SEA 096**  
**y**      **supp**

Senator Esquibel's bill increases fine for overweight vehicles, in proportional manner. The fine on overweight vehicles less than 2,000 pounds doesn't change from current \$25, but 2,000 to 10,000 overweight fines are increase by \$50 each, 10,001-12,000 increase to \$300, with corresponding increasing at an increasing rate fines up to 20,000 pound overweight. Each 1,000 pounds or fraction thereof above 20,000 overweight is subject to a \$200 per 1,000 pounds overweight fine. Agricultural producers should also realize that a \$50 annual permit for commodities that cannot be weighed is available; this permit exempts up to 10% overweight on an axle or total overweight of 5,000 pounds, whichever is less. This permit is not valid on interstate highways, is only valid for 90 days. There are also other 'get out of jail free cards' on overweight violations on hauling of agricultural products, for more information see W.S. 31-18-804 (b).

**SF0126**      **Water-beneficial use.**      **Hicks**      **D**  
**y**      **opp**

Senator Hick's last attempt at changing Wyoming water law this session was a bill that enumerated all beneficial uses of water that would create an appropriation. Since territorial times, this has been left to the discretion of the State Engineer's Office. While some of the beneficial uses created by the SEO are not widely used anymore (for example, steam power), the committees feeling was that requiring legislative action to create a beneficial use stifled innovation. The bill died in senate agriculture committee 2-3.

**SF0136**      **Water-source of supply.**      **Meier**      **D**  
**y**      **supp**

This bill created more specificity in cases where the State Engineer's Office is seeking to determine if surface and ground waters are interconnected, or in fact, a single body of water. While the senate agriculture committee made standing committee amendments, which passed, the bill failed senate committee of the whole 2-27-0-0-1 (Senator Scott declared a conflict, and the two aye votes were from the sponsors).

**SF0143**      **Federal natural resource policy.** **Bebout**      **SEA 072**      **ch141**      **3/3/2011**  
**y**      **supp**

Senator Bebout's bill amends the Federal Natural Resource Policy account, to allow funds to be used in conjunction with counties of the state, who previously could only join by assuming a portion of the legal proceeding's costs. The bill also appropriated an additional \$250,000, primarily based on concern with the Secretary of Interior's order regarding 'Wild Lands'.

**SF0149**      **Temporary water rights-replacement water.** **Meier**      **D**  
**y**      **opp**

This created 'temporary water rights' as a beneficial use, when used to replace water lost due to misappropriation elsewhere. There was some concern by legislators as to whether this might have been a personal bill of the sponsor. The bill died 1-4 in senate agriculture committee.

**SF0152**      **Tolling authority for I-80.**      **Von Flatern**      **D**  
**y**      **opp**

This bill of Senator Von Flatern would have allowed WYDOT to apply to USDOT to move I-80 to a toll road. WYDOT stated this was likely last chance for Wyoming to be 'grandfathered in' to this pilot program of USDOT. The bill failed 2-3 in committee.
